Using VMware vVols and VMFS within the Tanzu ecosystem combines VMware's premier technologies in powerful and important ways. While a key benefit of containers themselves is that they are efficient and can run on pretty much any infrastructure anywhere - a core requirement for them to be useful is the ability to generate, retain and re-use persistent application data on individual volumes. That requirement is what makes vVols in particular a perfect storage option to use with Tanzu. Kubernetes Audit Logs

Kubernetes audit logs record requests to the Kubernetes API server. To enable Kubernetes auditing on a management or Tanzu Kubernetes cluster, set the `ENABLE_AUDIT_LOGGING` variable to `true` before you deploy the cluster.

To access these logs in Tanzu Kubernetes Grid, navigate to `/var/log/kubernetes/audit.log` on the control plane node. If you deploy Fluent Bit on the cluster, it will forward the logs to your log destination. For instructions, see Implementing Log Forwarding with Fluent Bit.

vSphere with Tanzu provides a vSphere Plugin for `kubect1`. The vSphere Plugin for `kubect1` extends the standard `kubect1` commands so that you can connect to the Supervisor Cluster from `kubect1` by using vCenter Single Sign-On credentials. Once you have installed the vSphere Plugin for `kubect1`, you can connect the Tanzu Kubernetes Grid CLI to the Supervisor Cluster. Then, you can use the Tanzu Kubernetes Grid CLI to deploy and manage Tanzu Kubernetes clusters running in vSphere.

NOTE: On VMware Cloud on AWS and Azure VMware Solution, you cannot create a Supervisor Cluster, and need to deploy a management cluster to run `tkg` commands.

Overview: PersistentVolume, PersistentVolumeClaim, and StorageClass

Within a Kubernetes cluster, **PersistentVolume** (PV) objects provide shared storage for cluster pods that is unaffected by pod lifecycles. Storage is provisioned to the PV through a **PersistentVolumeClaim** (PVC) object, which defines how much and how the pod accesses the underlying storage. For more information, see Persistent Volumes in the Kubernetes documentation.

Cluster administrators can define **StorageClass** objects that let cluster users dynamically create PVC and PV objects with different storage types and rules. Tanzu Kubernetes Grid also provides default **StorageClass** objects that let users provision persistent storage in a turnkey environment.

Tanzu Kubernetes Grid

Tanzu Kubernetes Grid, otherwise known as TKG, is the underlying Kubernetes distribution for all of VMware's Kubernetes based products. It's part of vSphere with Kubernetes. It's part of TKGI (what was once PKS). But it's not just a distribution...it's also a standalone lifecycle manager that heavily utilizes Cluster API to manage virtual machines on which Kubernetes runs.

I'm not going to get into how TKG works, other than to say one of the first things you do with TKG is to deploy a management cluster. That cluster is then used to manage the life cycle of many other k8s "workload" clusters.

About Kubernetes Pod Security Policies

Kubernetes pod security policies (PSPs) are cluster-level resources that control the security of pods. Using PSPs gives you control over the types of pods that can be deployed and the types of accounts that can deploy them.

A PodSecurityPolicy resource defines a set of conditions that a pod must satisfy to be deployable. If the conditions are not met, the pod cannot be deployed. A single PodSecurityPolicy must validate a pod in its entirety. A pod cannot have some of its rules in one policy and some in another.

There are various ways to implement the use of pod security policies in Kubernetes. The typical approach is by using role-based access control (RBAC) objects. ClusterRole and ClusterRoleBinding apply cluster-wide; Role and RoleBinding apply to a specific namespace. If a RoleBinding is used, it only lets pods run in the same namespace as the binding.

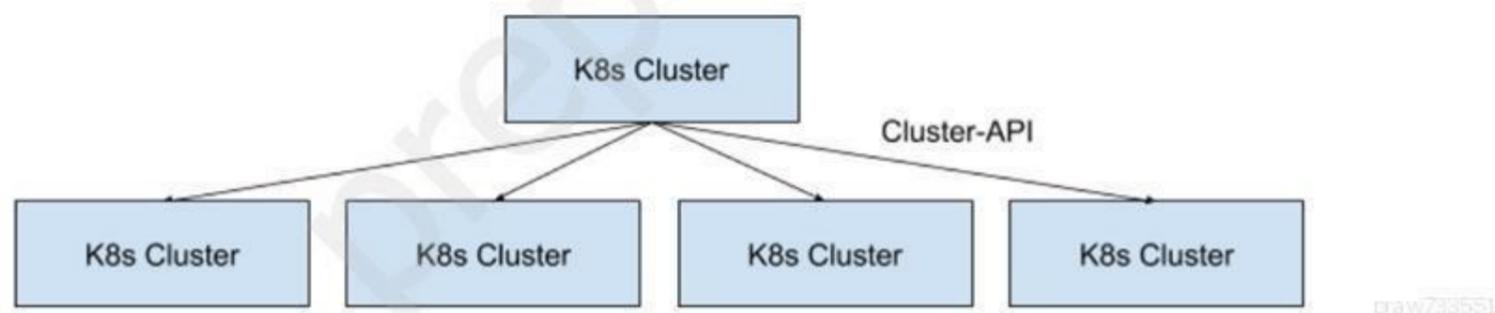

Two **key goals of Cluster API** are to manage the full lifecycle of a Kubernetes cluster, including scaling up and scaling down the cluster, and to give infrastructure providers a common framework to build against so that everyone can have a common workflow irrespective of where they intend to consume CPUs, memory, or network resources. That's easier said than done, of course, so here comes the first thing to get your head around—with Cluster API, Kubernetes clusters are provisioned, scaled, and de-provisioned by an external Kubernetes cluster. It is, in effect, turtles all the way down.

Tanzu Kubernetes Cluster Update Requirements

Read the release notes before you perform a Tanzu Kubernetes cluster update.

To update Tanzu Kubernetes clusters, first perform a vSphere Namespaces update. When you perform a vSphere Namespace update, all Tanzu Kubernetes clusters must be in a running state. See [Update the Supervisor Cluster by Performing a vSphere Namespaces Update](#).

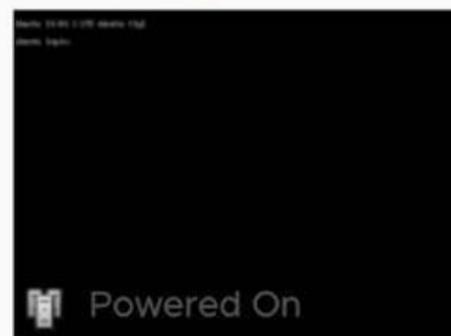

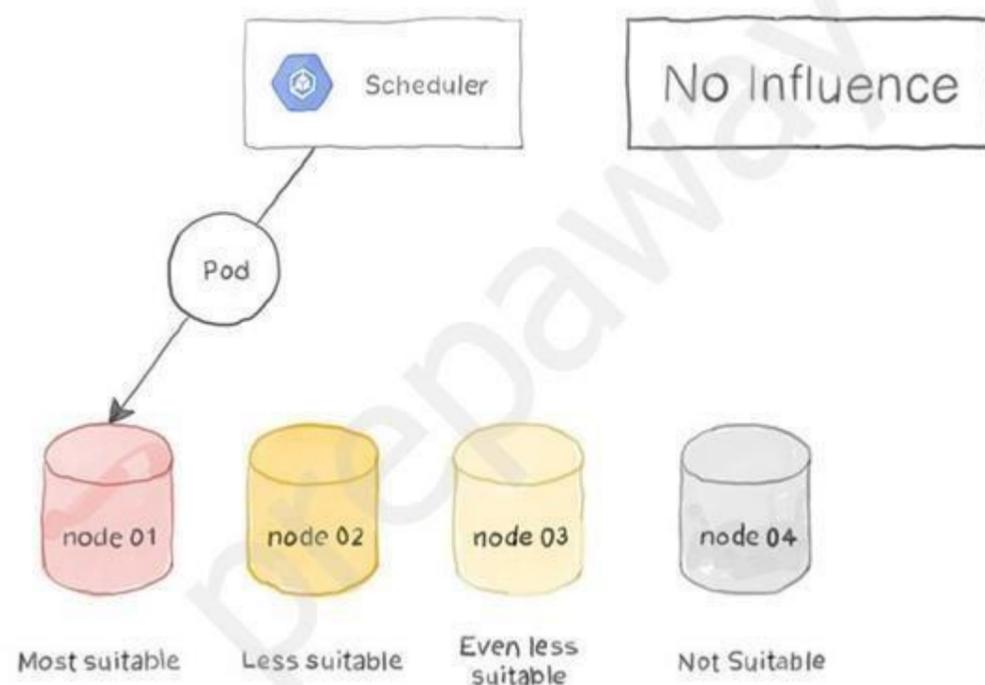
